MAG Artist Profile

Artist's Name: Deborah Faupel MAG member since: Joined in 2013

During the Renaissance epoch, scientist and artist were often an occupation of a single person. Currently it is difficult to find one person with the talent for many different arts, as well as science. This is why meeting Deborah Faupel will surprise you and confirm that indeed such talents do exist in this present time.

Personal Information: Deborah was born in St Louis, Missouri and started to paint when she was 10 years old, winning her first award while in 5th grade. Music was always in the house, and Deborah learned to play guitar, studied piano and took voice lessons for many years. Despite the push from her medical doctor father who trained Deborah in science and wanted her to become a scientist, she attended Fontbonne University majoring in music. Graduating with a bachelor degree in music



she spent the next 10 years in that field and was a featured soloist at The Lincoln Center, the Washington National Cathedral, and the Grand Ole Opry. As a solo artist with Con Brio Records she recorded in the Nashville RCA studios where she met country music legends Tammy Wynette & Johnny Cash. The very busy life of a musician did not leave time for a family, so after Deborah married Danny, a musician and her husband of 32 years, she focused her career in medical research administration. Here again she had great success. In director positions

she managed large groups of professionals at renowned research centers including UCLA Cancer Center, Washington University Medical School, and the University of Wisconsin.

Art/Education background: Deborah believes that painting and music share similarities since both invoke images for the viewer--painting as the visual interpretation and music as the aural interpretation--and this is why these arts are most appealing to her. When she paints she does not want to just copy the subject, she paints to create her own unique vision. When she was just 16 she worked hard and saved \$750 for a trip to Europe, visiting the Van Gogh and Rembrandt museums, The Louvre and the Uffizi Gallery. One can see that the modern art influences (especially by the impressionists) in her paintings are mixed with old tradition. Deborah's bright colors and skillful compositions bring the viewer many wonderful feelings. Her paintings invoke



many deep personal associations that one can almost daydream looking at her work.



Medium: Deborah is a photographer and pastelist. She enjoys the tactile nature of feeling the chalk grind against the paper and watching the colors grow. It all began for her when as a young girl she would rip out full-page Breck™ shampoo ads from magazines, borrow her mother's makeup, and reproduce these portraits on paper, gently blending in the pressed powder, rouge and eye shadow.



Mountain Artists Guild Awards \$5000 in Scholarships to local youth By Donna Carver

Friday, March 25th, Mountain Artists Guild (MAG), one of the oldest visual art organizations in the state of Arizona, held their Annual Scholarship Presentation Ceremony. MAG has been "Keeping Art Alive" in Prescott and Yavapai County since 1949; and also been awarding Scholarships since 1950 to young people who have been schooled in Yavapai County. Donna Carver, Scholarship Chairperson, presided over the Ceremony. The Jurors of this year's Scholarships were led by Master Artist, Doug Oliver along with Master Artist Eric Slayton and Professional Artist Linda Umphrey. These accomplished artists all live in the Prescott area but their art is bought by collectors both nationally and internationally. They all have done so much to keep art alive in our local area.

This year MAG awarded \$5000 in Scholarships to six very talented and deserving students. The Award Recipients hailed from Bradshaw High School, Prescott High School and Prescott College. The Ceremony was well attended by not only those receiving the Awards and their families but friends, teachers, the public at large and Mountain Artists Guild's Members.

The purpose of the Mountain Artists Guild (MAG) Scholarship program is to assist first-time or continuing full-time college students who are majoring or minoring in the visual arts with financial assistance and career development. These Scholarships are intended for visual artists who are only creating in 2D and 3D.. This includes digital photography, analog photography, drawing, painting, fine art printmaking, collage, sculpture, ceramics, video, film and other related 2D and 3D forms of art.

The awarding of the Scholarships was based on the students' artistic merit, academic achievement, and dedication to the field of visual arts. Since MAG serves Yavapai County, students applying for this scholarship had to reside within its boundaries or have graduated from Senior High School within Yavapai County; this also included home schooled students.

The student applicants were required to submit portfolios which included: a minimum of six photographs or scanned images of their original art, a letter of recommendation, and a personal statement. The portfolio had to represent the range of their visual style and mastery of media. All work had to be less than 2 years old. Photographs had to accurately represent their work (i.e. no substantially alter photos) and had to adhere with Copyright laws. For photographers they also had to submit two raw original photos / images which have not been manipulated in any form or manner.

Funds for these Scholarships were raised during "Mountain Artists Guild's Scholarship Auction" which is held annually early in December. Local professional artists donate their original works of art. The art ranges from paintings, fine art prints such as monotypes, etchings, and collographs, pottery, ceramics, woodcarving; works of art in glass and bronze, fabric art, jewelry and Sculptures.

All of this was made possible by the wonderful people from our community who believe, as Mountain Artists Guild does, in supporting the future academic careers of our youth. They buy tickets for Mountain Artists Guilds Scholarship Auction. They then bid and buy these wonderful original works of art. The evening is always full of wine, food, fun, art and a feeling of supporting an important mutual cause, that of creating funds for the future academic careers of our Community's Youth.
