## President's Message

As I share this, we still do not have a paid claim from the city for the flooding at the end of February.

Today, I discovered the street is REALLY open on both ends of our section of Alarcon from Sheldon and Willis. The street looks particularly lovely and there is some good parking, not so much on our side, but across the street. We will have a Grand Re-Opening during the 4th Friday in August.

As I discussed with you in January, in my initial letter, things are changing here at MAG. We have active committees involved in improving our processes, productivity, and financial picture. We must evolve and move quickly into the digital age. We are signing people up for the Holiday Miniature Show (Judy Lewis, Chair). This will be part of the Featured Artists wall in the Gallery.

Also on the Featured Artist wall, will be the 6x6 (donated) Fundraising Show (canvases available in the gallery). Last year our fundraiser netted about \$2000 to help us with our building fund. Please help us by painting a 6x6. They sell for approximately \$40 and all proceeds go to MAG's Building Fund. Additional cash donations are welcome for this fund! We do have Featured Artist opportunities (juried) and you can contact Blair Worthington if you are interested.

SAVE the DATE (DATE CHANGE!): Saturday, November 4, 2017 for our MAG Scholarship MASK-querade Party, wine tasting and Live Auction. 5PM - 9PM. Heavy appetizers and wine tastings. We will be selling your donated artworks, including 2D, 3D and Jewelry. If you would be willing to work with an artist on a 1-1 and donate your time (minimum bids required), we will have a silent auction for these special donations of your time. You would receive a certificate for your taxes of the value of your purchased gift to MAG. All proceeds will go to our Scholarship Fund. This year we awarded 3 - \$2000 scholarships. Harold Nelson was our Scholarship chair. More information will follow with ticket pricing and prizes for winning MASKs.

Beginning in September, we will again introduce our Monthly Membership Meeting and Info/or Demo/or Instruction before 4<sup>th</sup> Friday. Our next Quarterly Membership Meeting will be Saturday, October 21st from 9:30 (critique), 10AM Business and Artist Demo and adjourn at noon and includes brunch type refreshments.



## MAG Artist Profile - Cin Hollins - Long time member

Cin Hollins has been a resident of Prescott since 2004. From childhood she has been interested in creating works of art. Her interest in jewelry started when she made her own clothes and created earrings to match those outfits.

Cin's philosophy on making her unique pieces of jewelry is "No,

woman wants to see her jewelry coming towards her." Hence the name for her jewelry 'OriginalCinJewelry.'





She is a certified Art Clay and Precious Metal Clay instructor. She has taken jewelry making classes at Yavapai College to improve her skills. Other techniques used have been self-taught or through online instructional classes.

In September 2011 Cin was selected as Artist of the Month by Wire Sculpture.Com. The piece selected was called Captured Prescott Nights, which is a wire wrapped Druze. In 2014 her Kumihimo with a foldform copper pendant was selected for Accent Bead Designs website.

Her pieces may incorporate several different techniques. These techniques include metal work, precious metal clays, watercolor, kumihimo, alcohol inks, wire wrapping, wire weaving, polymer clay, beading, and fused glass.



Cin is also a tireless volunteer for MAG. She has served on the Gallery Committee and 4th Friday's for many years. You will see Cin's jewelry in most MAG Gallery shows.



The 67th Annual Arts & Crafts Festival is fast approaching and we need volunteers!

We have 3 volunteer categories:

Yes, that's right, the MAG Volunteer Tent is still in the show! Any volunteer who participates will be allowed one piece in the tent and will receive 100% of their sales.

## Tent will be placed at Booth 93.

In an effort to conserve expenses and still provide volunteers with a tent we will need help with set-up and tear down on Friday and Sunday Evening. These shifts are separate from working intake and running the volunteer tent and do require physical labor. Our Maintenance worker, Kenny Wade, will be there to assist with general set-up and transportation of the tents and supplies to the Square, but additional transportation is always appreciated.
